General Summer Camp Information

How to Register

We encourage early registration since registrations are processed on a first come, first served basis as many camps will fill up quickly. Registration will take place online at www.ravenscroft.org/summer. Registration will continue until the first day of individual camp.

Method of Payment

Our online registration will accept Visa, Master Card, and Discover. Electronic Bank checks are also acceptable and should be made payable to Ravenscroft School. Payment for all camps is due at time of registration.

Refund Policy

All summer programs require a minimum enrollment; In the event the program must be cancelled, you will be notified at least two weeks prior to the start date. Program fees are fully refundable when the program is cancelled by Ravenscroft. Program fees are refundable as follows:

- 1. Cancellations received on or before May 15 will be entitled to a full refund less a \$25.00 cancellation fee per program.
- 2. There will be no refund if cancellation takes place after a program begins or if a camper is suspended from a program due to failure to abide by Ravenscroft code of conduct. Verified medical / hardship situations will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- 3. There will be no refund if a child is suspended from a program due to parent behavior.

Pick Up/Drop Off

Campers are to be dropped off and picked up promptly at the classroom or designated camp location. Ravenscroft does not provide supervision before or after camp. Families who leave their children unattended on campus will be subject to their child being suspended from the camp program.

Medication Policy

Academics

Conquering High School - Session I

<u>Time</u>: 9:30am - 11:30am <u>Tuition</u>: \$245 Coed Rising 9th - 12th Grades <u>Location</u>: Murphy Hall Upper School Room 134 <u>Instructor</u>: Janet Smith

It's never too early, or too late, to conquer the academic tasks necessary to succeed in high school. This class is designed to introduce students to typical high school expectations. Students will learn to identify personal learning styles and combine these with effective learning strategies; to take effective notes from lectures, textbooks, and other media; to utilize technology to enhance study skills; to establish effective personal organizational systems; to develop sound time/task management strategies to handle both classroom and co-curricular activities; and to develop efficient test taking skills. SAT Critical Reading & Writing - Session I (Two Week Camp)

Time: 11:15am - 1:15pm Tuition: \$340* Coed Rising 10th - 12th Grades

* \$610 when combined with SAT Math Prep

<u>Location</u>: Murphy Hall Upper School Room 140 <u>Instructor</u>: Angela Connor/Marcia Jones This class is designed to prepare students for the new SAT. This course will teach students the format of the test and provide both strategies and practice for questions on critical reading, sentence completion, grammar, usage, and writing. For many years, Angela Connor and Marcia Jones have taught this summer course, helping students improve their scores. Students taking the SAT Verbal session will need to purchase the Barron's How to Prepare for the SAT I, 24th edition, available at most area bookstores.

SAT Math Prep - Session I (Two Week Camp)

<u>Time</u>: 9am - 11am <u>Tuition</u>: \$340* Coed Rising 10th - 12th Grades

* \$610 when combined with SAT Critical Reading & Writing

<u>Location</u>: Murphy Hall Upper School Room 140 <u>Instructor</u>: Janine Wood/Ann Carroll/Ed Durham

This class is designed to prepare students for the math section of the SAT. In addition to reviewing topics from pre-algebra, algebra, and geometry, students will become familiar with the format of the test and learn strategies. This course will also include a discussion of the effective use of a graphing calculator. Much time will be devoted to practice problems similar to those on the SAT. Mrs. Wood and Mrs. Carroll have taught this summer course to help students improve their scores for many years. What to bring: a Graphing calculator.

Arts

Beginning Jazz Band

This course provides an opportunity for students to learn jazz and stage band music over the course of the week and to present a short performance on the last camp day. Now you want to take your biking to a new level... well than this is the camp for you! We will start out on Crabtree Creek's local "pump track" and skills area that includes a see-saw teeter, several elevated

"skinnys", a zig-zag teeter and newly built dirt jumps all for the riding. From there, we will venture out to test our skills out on other local trails, including a trip to Legend Park in Clayton that is renowned for its technical riding and mad skills section. We will also work with the local park systems to learn proper trail maintenance, local bike shops to learn bicycle maintenance and local clubs to learn about what we can do to help the sport. All instructors are certified in First Aid and CPR. All campers must provide their own bikes, helmets and other protection as necessary.
